

**ORDER OF THE HEALTH OFFICER
OF THE CITY OF BERKELEY DIRECTING
CITY OF BERKELEY EMPLOYEES TO TAKE ALL NECESSARY
MEASURES TO PROVIDE TEMPORARY SHELTER TO INDIVIDUALS
EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS WHO MAY BE INFECTED WITH OR
HAVE BEEN EXPOSED TO COVID-19**

DATE OF ORDER: MARCH , 2020

UNDER THE AUTHORITY OF CALIFORNIA HEALTH AND SAFETY CODE SECTIONS 101040, 101085, AND 120175, THE HEALTH OFFICER OF THE CITY OF BERKELEY (“HEALTH OFFICER”) ORDERS:

1. The intent of this Order is to help ensure that all individuals who may have become infected with or have been exposed to COVID-19, including individuals experiencing homelessness, have access to safe housing that isolates or quarantines them from other members of the community.
2. To carry out the intent of this Order, City of Berkeley Emergency Operations Center staff are hereby authorized and ordered to:
 - a. Take all necessary measures to allow for the placement of up to eight recreational vehicles to be delivered to and parked at 1281 University Avenue, Berkeley for purposes of providing temporary shelter for individuals experiencing homelessness who may be infected with or have been exposed to COVID-19;
 - b. Take all necessary measures to allow for the use of the single-family residence located at 1654 Fifth Street, Berkeley for purposes of providing temporary shelter for individuals experiencing homelessness who may be infected with or have been exposed to COVID-19; and
 - c. Take all necessary measures to install hard-sided tents or similar temporary structures on the property located at 1654 Fifth Street, Berkeley for purposes of providing temporary shelter for individuals experiencing homelessness who may be infected with or have been exposed to COVID-19.
3. Emergency Operations staff shall have authority to install any facilities or structures, including fencing and sanitation facilities, necessary to implement the requirements of this Order.
4. This Order shall be implemented in compliance with the requirements of Section 112 of Appendix O of the California Building Code (Emergency Fire and Life Safety Requirements) and, to the extent feasible, with other requirements of Appendix O of the California Building Code, adopted as Berkeley Municipal Code section 19.28.100.

Order of the City Health Officer to Provide Temporary Shelter to Certain Individuals
Experiencing Homelessness

5. This Order shall become effective immediately and will continue to be in effect until the expiration of the State of Emergency declared by the City Manager on March 3, 2020.
6. Copies of this Order shall promptly be: (1) posted at 2134 Martin Luther King Jr. Way, Berkeley, CA 94704; (2) posted on the City's website at www.cityofberkeley.info; and (3) provided to any member of the public requesting a copy of this Order.
7. If any provision of this Order to the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held to be invalid, the remainder of the Order, including the application of such part or provision to other persons or circumstances, shall not be affected and shall continue in full force and effect. To this end, the provisions of this Order are severable.
